UN Sustainable Development Goal 13 calls for member countries to take urgent action to combat climate change and its impacts. Last June, Canada tabled its fourth Federal Sustainable Development Strategy. A major goal in that strategy is effective action on climate change. The target is to reduce Canada's carbon emissions by 30%. Our country has also committed \$2.65 billion to climate action in developing countries. Canada is working through the UN to put these commitments into action.

Climate change contributes to conflict. We can prevent violence by reducing our environmental impact, both at home and abroad.


